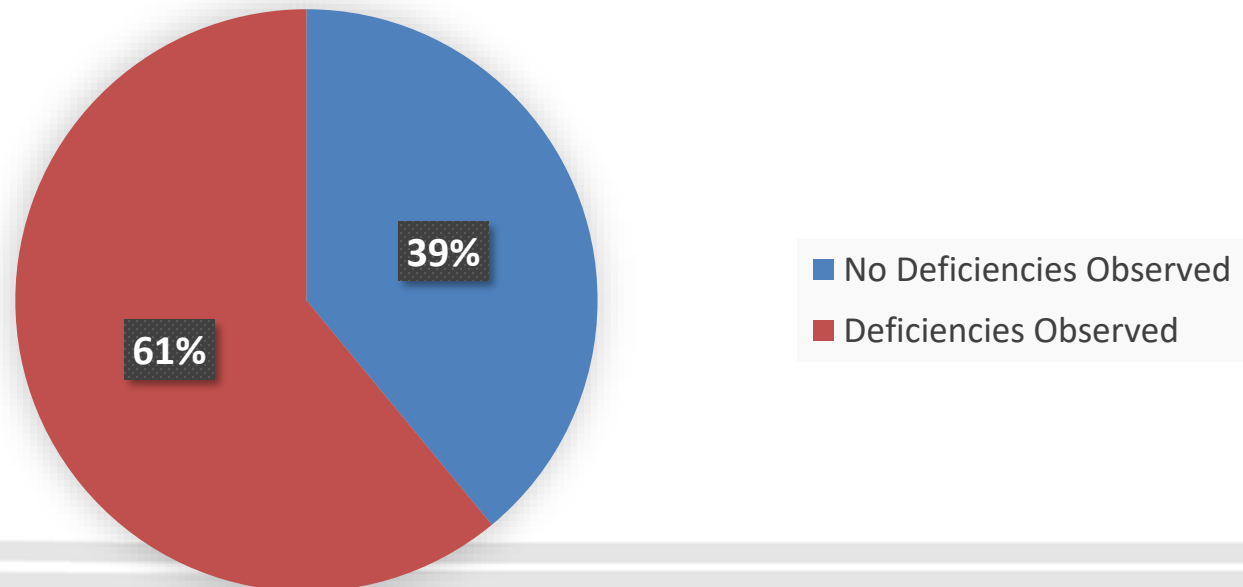

Summary of Routine GDP Inspections in 2022

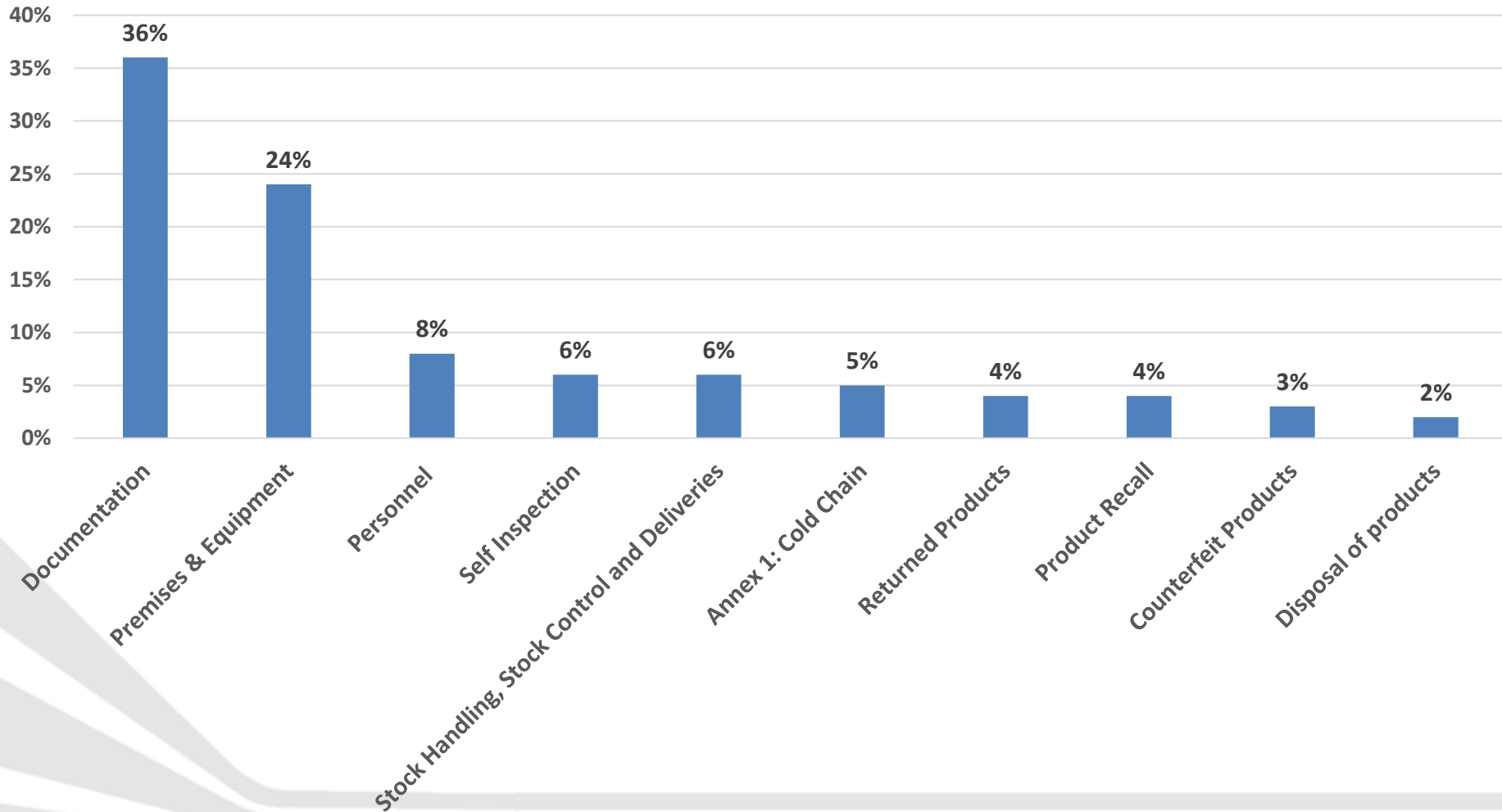
- 140 GDP inspections were conducted in 2022.
- 55 out of 140 inspections conducted (39 %) were found to have **no** deficiencies.
- 85 out of 140 inspections conducted (61 %) were found to have deficiencies.

Most Common NCs 2022

#	GDP Chapters	Percentage
1	Documentation	36%
2	Premises & Equipment	24%
3	Personnel	8%
4	Self Inspection	6%
5	Stock Handling, Stock Control and Deliveries	6%

Documentation, Premises & Equipment and Self Inspection remain within the top 5 of common GDP deficiencies cited in 2022, with Personnel and Stock Handling, Stock Control and Deliveries also climbing up the top 5 Common GDP Deficiencies list.
